This Holy Week, we are inviting everyone to celebrate a simple version of the Passover meal through our Small Group ministries. Each Small Group will host a very basic Passover meal including lamb, bitter herbs and flatbread. During the meal, scripture and discussion will address the meaning of the first Passover celebration and how it relates to us today in Christ.

For folks who are not part of a small group, you are invited to join Pastor Aaron and Krista’s group in the Church Fellowship hall on April 17th from 6-8PM. For those joining pastor Aaron’s group, please sign up during the worship services on the 6th and the 13th. Participants will be invited to help provide food for the group.

While the celebration of the Passover meal developed into a formal meal with elaborate rituals of remembrance, this Passover celebration will harken back to the text from Exodus 12 and the original spirit of the Passover. I hope you can join in!

Following the Passover celebration (either during your small group time, or Thursday night on the 17th) We will hold a meditative worship service on Good Friday, April 18th from 6-7PM in the Sanctuary.

Finally, on Easter Sunday, you are invited to bring a flower with you to adorn the cross as is our tradition. As the cross transforms from the bare wood to a blossoming branch, may we be reminded of God’s Word from the songs of Isaiah, promising a Messiah, Servant-King who would rise up as a righteous branch from the stump of Jesse to bring righteousness to the earth and to provide atonement for the sins of the world.

Preach the Gospel, and Leave the Results To God

“Where is the wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the disputer of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of this world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world through wisdom did

not know God, it pleased God through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe. — 1 Corinthians 1:20-21

“Who then is Paul, and who is Apollos, but ministers through whom you believed, as the Lord gave to each one? I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase. So then neither he who plants is anything, nor he who waters, but God who gives the increase.” — 1 Corinthians 3:5-9

“And since we have the same spirit of faith, according to what is written, ‘I believed and therefore I spoke,’ we also believe and therefore speak.” — 2 Corinthians 4:13

When we really believe the Gospel of the Grace of God—when we really believe that it is the power of God unto salvation, the only power of salvation in this wicked world of ours—it is a comparatively easy thing to preach it, to preach it in its purity, to preach it in the face of a scoffing, truculent and murdering world. Here is the secret—I do not now say of a minister’s power as a preacher of God’s grace—but of a minister’s ability to preach at all this Gospel in such a world as we live in. Believe this Gospel,

and you can and will preach it. Let men say what they will, and do what they will—let them injure, ridicule, persecute, slay—believe this Gospel and you will preach it. Men often say of some element of the Gospel: “I can’t preach that.” Sometimes they mean that the world will not receive this or that. Sometimes they mean that the world will not endure this or that. Sometimes they mean that they cannot so preach this or that as to win the respect or the sympathy or the acceptance of the world. The Gospel cannot be preached? Cannot be preached? It can be preached if you will believe it. Here is the root of all your difficulties. You do not fully believe this Gospel! Believe it! Believe it and then it will preach itself! God has not sent us into the world to say the most plausible things we can think of; to touch men with what they already believe. He has sent us to preach unpalatable truths to a world lying in wickedness; apparently absurd truths to men, proud of their intellects; mysterious truths to men who are carnal and cannot receive the things of the Spirit of God. Shall we despair? Certainly, if it is left to us not only to plant and to water but also to give the increase. Certainly not, if we appeal to and depend upon the Spirit of faith.

But let Him move on our hearts and we will believe these truths; and, even as it is written, I believed and therefore have I spoken, we also will believe and therefore speak. Let Him but move on the hearts of our hearers and they too will believe what He has led us to speak. We cannot proclaim to the world that the house is afire—it is a disagreeable thing to say, scarcely to be risked in the presence of those whose interest it is not to believe it? But believe it, and how quickly you rush forth to shout the unpalatable truth! So believe it and we shall assert to the world that it is lost in its sin, and rushing down to an eternal doom; that in Christ alone is there redemption; and through the Spirit alone can men receive this redemption. What care we if it be unpalatable, if it be true? For if it be true, it is urgent.

MISSION MEMO

Peace Memorial has been a "sponsor" of Stearns Elementary School for many years, providing the children attending that school with much needed supplies. Noreen Rhoades has been our school liaison. She keeps in contact with the staff to find out what is needed the most at any given time. These needs used to be what most think of as "school supplies"- crayons, pencils, paper and such. The Klamath County School District now provides those supplies to the elementary schools. The needs, though, remain but in a different way. There are many students who come to school without necessary clothing. It could be without a coat or gloves and hat. It could be without the right size underclothes. Or an "accident" happens at school and a parent is not available to respond. The Mission Committee helps provide those needs.

This year we have expanded to include Shasta Elementary as a "sponsored" school, and boy, do they have a need for our help! Noreen has talked with the staff and has quite a list.

To help fill out these schools' "wish lists," the Mission Committee will be organizing a "LET'S SHOP" day. The date and time is yet to be determined. The plan is to meet at WalMart (it tends to have everything we're looking for), shop 'til we run out of money, return to the church to divide the items between the two schools, then meet for lunch (shopping is an exhausting activity, you know). We'll be inviting as many of you as would like to join us. And don't fret that we don't have a date and time as yet. Once we do, we won't stop yapping about it.

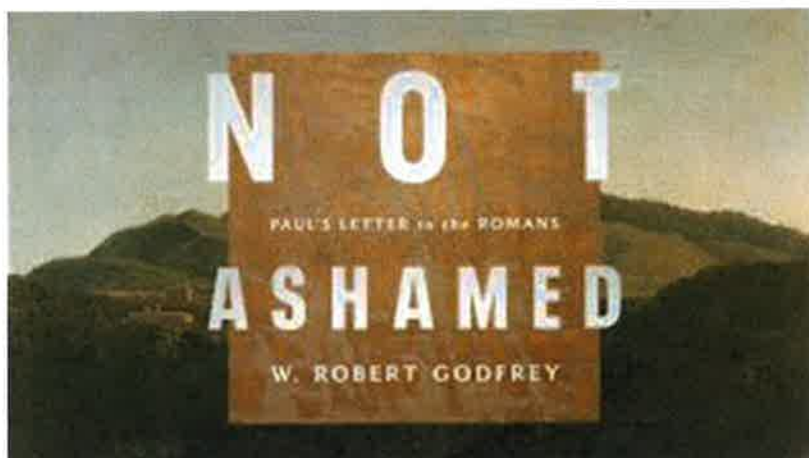
