From the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

How has your New Year celebration gone so far this year? I remember last year- hearing many expressions of relief that 2020 was finally over- expressions of hope for how much better 2021 would certainly be... Ahh the foolishness. 2021 has shaped up to be as challenging as 2020 if not worse for many.

Over the past two years anxiety has increased, families have become strained as our culture continues to polarize over every conceivable issue. It truly seems our culture is going through an existential crisis- the fundamental understanding of the nature of reality has become lost. As a result, things that just a few years ago would have been considered unthinkable are now becoming normalized. Respect for our institutions is at an all-time low, trust in our leaders is tribal, Lawlessness is flourishing, and contempt for one another has become rooted in our hearts. Despair seems to be on the rise- even in the Church.

But here is an important point. Jesus has gifted us with Truth. And the Truth is, God is good. He is sovereign, and in Jesus, He has provided redemption for humanity. That redemption results in Eternal Life- a life filled with Joy, Peace and Hope all in the loving embrace of God's fellowship- and fellowship with each other. Given this great truth, why do so many of us feel despair? I would suggest it is because many of us have not tended the promises of God well in our hearts and minds.

I am going to share with you this year some practical steps that we as followers of Christ are called to pursue that help us live in the hope, joy and

peace that God has gifted us.

First, for the month of January, "Tend the Hope." Hope in some ways is like a fire. It requires tending or it can go out on us and leave us cold and

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in the dark. We tend our hope- and keep it alive and hot by feeding it three types of fuel on a regular basis. These fuel sources are really prayer disciplines.

Hope-Fuel 1: Godly Thinking.

From Philippians 4:8,9,

"whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things. 9 Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me—put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you."

In this pericope (a pericope is a section of Biblical text), we are given instructions to direct our thinking- to actively pursue thoughts- to set our minds- on the things of God. While I hate to say it this way, maintaining Hope involves “positive thinking”. Though this type of positive thinking is not JUST “think happy thoughts” – rather these are thoughts that choose to focus on and marinate in the things that reflect the nature of God- nobleness, righteousness, purity, loveliness, and everything that is good (admirable). Often despair, anger, fear, aggression and contempt emerge within us because our minds have been unintentionally soaking in negativity, and the things of the fallen order rather than the things of God. So think godly thoughts- redirect your daily inner monologue toward the light! This includes how we think about others as well- from government officials to our friends and even family. Choose to think of their good qualities, and not only that, but strive to see them through Jesus’ eyes. “For God so loved the world...”

Hope-fuel 2: Trust in God’s Promises. As Paul states in Romans 15:3,

“May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

God is the “God of hope”! - He can fill us with all joy and peace as we TRUST in Him. This is also a kind of “positive thinking.” We trust in His nature (His Goodness, His wisdom, His power) in all things and submit to His Will. We trust in His promises. Here are a few key promises upon which we can secure our trust:

- Isaiah 41:10

10 So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

- John 16:33

33 “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”

- Psalm 37:23-24

23 The LORD makes firm the steps of the one who delights in him; 24 though he may stumble, he will not fall, for the LORD upholds him with his hand.

- 2 Corinthians 12:9-10

9 But he said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness.” Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ’s power may rest on me. 10 That is why, for Christ’s sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

- 1 Peter 2:24

24 “He himself bore our sins” in his body on the cross, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; “by his wounds you have been healed.”

- James 1:2-3

2 Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, 3 because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance.

- Exodus 14:14

14 The LORD will fight for you; you need only to be still.”

- Romans 8:28

28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose.

- Mark 11:24

24 Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours.

- Revelation 3:5

5 The one who is victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out the name of that person from the book of life, but will acknowledge that name before my Father and his angels.

- Romans 8:31-35

31 What, then, shall we say in response to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? 32 He who did not spare his own Son, but gave him up for us all—how will he not also, along with him, graciously give us all things? 33 Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies. 34 Who then is the one who condemns? No one. Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. 35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?

There are so many others. But they all have a common core. In Jesus' death and resurrection, we are offered deliverance from sin and adoption as God's Children. As we receive that gift through faith- we are filled with the Holy Spirit and sealed for heaven. This foundational truth transforms all of our worldly experience because no matter what happens, the victory we have in Jesus- of Eternal Life and the love of God, is untarnished. The darker this world gets, the brighter our hope in God's promises becomes.

Hope-Fuel 3: Give Thanks. From 1 Thessalonians 5:18:

"...give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

Have you ever struggled over what God's will is for you? This text makes it pretty clear. For those in Christ- God's call upon your life- His will for you is to GIVE THANKS. This isn't just a call to remember a few of your favorite things and thank Him. Rather it is a call to give thanks "IN ALL CIRCUMSTANCES." This is far from the cultural norm of counting your blessings. This is a deep spiritual discipline of submitting all things and all circumstances to God's sovereignty, His wisdom and His goodness. By giving thanks in all circumstances (even in painful, confusing and dark times), we are declaring the goodness of God and our hope in the resurrection. Giving thanks is our part in transforming our inner world from despair to joy in the Holy Spirit. (if you do not have the Holy Spirit, giving thanks in all circumstances will seem a foolish and hollow endeavor. But for those in Christ- the discipline of thanksgiving is supernaturally transformative as the Spirit fills us with "all joy and peace in believing.")

I've shared with you ONE of the practical steps in fostering a wonderful year- tending our Hope. Next month I will share with you another step- Fostering Love. So join me in making January a month of joy and peace as we keep our hope alive.

For now, as Paul said, "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Here is to a Hopeful New Year in Jesus Christ our Lord.

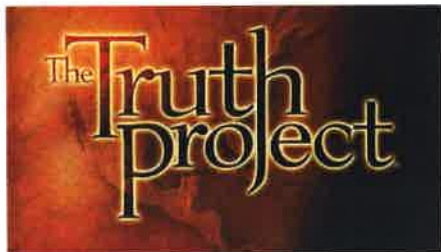

The Inheritance of Israel



Pastor Aaron Beaty and Deacon Geri Coker continue through the story of the nation of Israel as she comes into her inheritance, the promised land. Now that the tribes of Israel have occupied the land, they face a new challenge- learning to live as the people of God with the Lord as their king, without a human ruler. The book of Judges records Israel's struggles to trust the Lord during times of unique challenge when the surrounding culture is hostile to the ways of God. God delivers even when His people stray. The book of Judges provides a profound lesson to the Church today as we see many parallels between the 21st century and the time when everyone did what was right in their own eyes.

The Truth Project is a DVD-based small group curriculum comprised of 12 video lessons taught by Dr. Del Tackett, instructor of Christian Worldview at the Focus Leadership Institute and a former Senior Vice President of our ministry. This study is the starting point for looking at life from a biblical perspective. Each lesson discusses in great detail the relevance and importance of living the Christian worldview in daily life.

We believe this curriculum can be a catalyst for exponential change within the body of Christ, as thousands of people are "transformed by the renewing of [their] mind" (Romans 12:2). As He has throughout history, God continues to call ordinary people to make an eternal difference in our world."
