

From the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

In this month's newsletter I am continuing the series on how to make 2022 a great year by focusing in on key teachings of God's Word that lead us into a life that really embraces the substance of our faith. In January, the lesson was how to "Kindle Hope" in God's promises. Last month we looked at how to "Foster Love". This month we are going to look at possibly the most enjoyable of spiritual disciplines: REJOICE!

In Philippians 4, Paul writes:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand;" -Philippians 4:4,5

There are so many verses in the Bible encouraging us and calling us to rejoice- to celebrate and give thanks. Internally and externally, we are to be a people of rejoicing.

I: Celebrate for God is Good!

Revelation 4:11

"Worthy are You, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for You created all things, and by Your will they existed and were created."

Romans 1:20

"For His invisible attributes, namely, His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, ever since the creation of the world, in the things that have been made. So they [those who refuse to celebrate Him] are without excuse."

God is good- all the time and all the time, God is

good! The heart of our rejoicing is in WHO GOD IS. God: all knowing, all powerful, everywhere present, completely righteous and while He is just in all His ways, He is slow to anger and abounding in loving-kindness. Holy Holy Holy, is the Lord God

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almighty who was and is and is to come! All creation has an indwelling call to celebrate and give honor to God.

Much of Israel's identity revolves around key festivals and rituals. Each event is a celebration of God's Work. From the Pilgrim festivals each year, Passover (celebrating God's deliverance from Egypt), The Feast of Weeks (remembering God's Gift of His Word to Moses), and The Feast of Booths (remembering God's provision in the wilderness and in our daily lives), to the daily and annual sacrificial system and cleanliness rituals, God's nature and works are celebrated with joy and reverence. The people of Israel were called to be a people of rejoicing because of God – and a key part

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of that joy was to remember who God is and what He had done for them.

As Christians- we too are called to rejoice at who God is, and what He has done. We celebrate personally as we remember the truth of His Word and as we celebrate what He has done for us in Jesus Christ. We also rejoice as a body when we worship together and attend to God's Word, as we eat the bread and drink the cup of Communion.

Rejoice and celebrate who God is and what He has done.

II: Give Thanks, for God is With Us!

Psalm 5:11 "But let all who take refuge in You be glad, Let them ever sing for joy; And may You shelter them, That those who love Your name may exult in You."

The great delight of the faith is not JUST who God is and what He has done, but that He is with us NOW. As the Psalmist puts it: there is gladness and reason for joy or all who take refuge in and love the Lord. Why is that? Paul puts it this way:

"...hope (in the Lord) does not disappoint for the love of God HAS BEEN poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." -Romans 5:5

Did you catch that? We rejoice in the realization that the God of all things- the God of goodness and love IS with us. His love is poured out into us by the Holy Spirit that He has given. The joy of the faith is not just what WAS but what IS.

In Psalm 32:11, we read,

"Be glad in the Lord and rejoice, you righteous ones; And shout for joy, all you who are upright in heart."

Fellowship with God is a profound delight- for the righteous. For the unrighteous, God's presence will be an everlasting fire of condemnation. For the sinful cannot bear the countenance of God, and God will not endure sinners. And the truth is, we are all sinners- "There is no one righteous, not even one. There is no one who understands, no one who seeks God...

"All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God." -Romans 3:10; 23.

BUT the good news is that God has brought righteousness to us sinful people. As Romans continues in 3:24, while all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God, they "are justified by His grace as a gift through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus whom God has put forward as a propitiation by His blood, to be received by faith."

So we should be a people of Joy- celebrating the realization of God's promises through Jesus Christ in the present fellowship of the Holy Spirit.

III: Rejoice for what God Will Do!

2 Corinthians 1:20-22

"For all the promises of God find their Yes in Him [Jesus]. That is why it is through Him that we utter our Amen to God for His glory. And it is God who establishes us with you in Christ, and has anointed us, and who has also put His seal on us and given us His Spirit in our hearts as a guarantee."

While we celebrate the substance of our faith in fellowship with the Holy Spirit now, we are promised that the Spirit's presence and His work in our lives is just a piece of what is to come.

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Paul refers to the Holy Spirit in our lives now as a "guarantee" of the fullness of fellowship and renewal that is to come. Likewise, in Romans 8, Paul writes,

"I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us." Romans 8:18.

While God WAS- and did great things, while God IS- with us, saving, transforming and equipping us for all good works, God also WILL BE. Jesus is coming again, this time in glory. The Kingdom of Heaven will one day arrive and all things will be made right. The sinfulness of the world will be done away with, and the righteous (those who are under Christ's righteousness through faith) will be glorified and taken into the paradise of the new heavens and the new earth.

Conclusion:

We are invited and called to rejoice. To be a people marked with the Joy of the Lord- 1, in Who God is and what He has done, 2, in God's Fellowship with us Now and what He is doing, and 3, in God's promises yet to come. In all things we are to give thanks and celebrate, for we are God's children, adopted in the righteousness of Christ that we might glorify God and enjoy Him forever.

So celebrate, give thanks and rejoice. For God is good, all the time. And all the time, God is good.

May the Joy of the Lord fill your heart and mind through faith in Jesus Christ. Pastor Aaron

To live an engaged life until the day we die is no accident; it is the choice to live every day that God gives us, not simply exist. That is not denying the inevitability of death; but refusing to give in to it until it is our time.

We take advantage of the water aerobics classes in the well-heated pool, the chair exercises, and balance classes. There are many arts & crafts activities, bingo and group outings. Living here a person can be as active as they choose to be.

Independent senior living caters to seniors who are fully or mostly independent and want to move because they might live more adventurous lives, and feel less isolated. It's never too early to transition to senior living because even very healthy seniors can and do thrive in these communities.

"In a 2003 study, the Barna Research Group revealed a stunning statistic that continues to reverberate throughout the evangelical world – *only nine percent of professing Christians have a biblical worldview. The Barna Update*, "A Biblical Worldview Has a Radical Effect on a Person's Life," December 1, 2003.

Because of this, today's believers live very similarly to non-believers. A personal sense of significance is rarely experienced, we spend our money and time on things that fail to satisfy, and we begin to wonder what life's ultimate purpose really is. We are, in short, losing our bearings as a people and a nation.

To counter this downward slide within the body of Christ, Focus on the Family has launched one of the most ambitious and powerful projects in the history of our ministry – *Focus on the Family's The Truth Project* (\mathbb{R}) .

The Truth Project is a DVD-based small group curriculum comprised of 12 video lessons taught by Dr. Del Tackett, instructor of Christian Worldview at the Focus Leadership Institute and a former Senior Vice President of our ministry. This study is the starting point for looking at life from a biblical perspective. Each lesson discusses in great detail the relevance and importance of living the Christian worldview in daily life.

We believe this curriculum can be a catalyst for exponential change within the body of Christ, as thousands of people are "transformed by the renewing of [their] mind" (Romans 12:2). As He has throughout history, God continues to call ordinary people to make an eternal difference in our world."

Bring your own dinner and join us together as we re-construct a Biblical world-view by diving into the TRUTH.
