From the Pastor...

Dear Friends,

As we start up another program year, I would like to share with you a social media policy that our Session approved last month. While I have not seen our members misuse social media, I realize our church does not have a policy on its use and so this document is a preemptive tool intended to provide guidance to our officers, staff and members on maintaining a Christian presence online. Here's the policy and then I'll share a few thoughts about it:

Peace Memorial Evangelical Presbyterian Church Social Media Use Policy

Adopted by the Session: [8/19/25]

Purpose:

This policy exists to guide the use of social media in ways that honor Christ, promote unity, and reflect the mission of Peace Memorial Evangelical Presbyterian Church. Whether representing the church officially or posting personally as a member of our covenant community, we are all called to be salt and light in every space-including digital platforms.

1. Biblical Foundation

We believe that all our words, whether spoken or typed, are a reflection of our heart and witness. Scripture gives clear guidance:

- Ephesians 4:29: "Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up..."
- Colossians 4:6: "Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt..."

Philippians 4:8: "Whatever is true, whatever is honorable... think about these things."

As followers of Christ, we aim to use social media as a tool for truth, encouragement, and gospel witness.

2. General Guidelines

Whether posting on behalf of Peace Memorial or as individuals affiliated with the church, the following principles apply:

in all interactions, even when expressing disagreement or engaging videos. in debate.

- Do not post confidential information. This includes prayer requests, pastoral counseling details, or personal matters unless clear permission has been given.
- Refrain from divisive or harmful content. Avoid gossip, slander, or comments that damage the reputation of others or the unity of the church.
- Be mindful of public witness. Personal accounts that identify someone as a member, leader, or staff person at Peace Memorial should reflect Christian character.
- Fact-check and think before posting. Avoid sharing unverified or inflammatory content, especially around sensitive topics.

3. Use of Official Church Social Media

- Only individuals authorized by the Session or Communications Team may post to official church social media accounts (Facebook, Website, Instagram, etc.).
- All official posts should align with the mission, doctrine, and ministry goals of Peace Memorial EPC.

Content may include: event announcements, worship highlights, Speak with grace and truth. Use respectful, Christ-like tone devotional content, ministry updates, and approved photos or

4. Personal Social Media and Leadership

Church staff, elders, deacons, and ministry leaders are held to a higher standard of accountability. Those in visible leadership roles are expected to:

- Reflect Peace Memorial's values and witness in their online presence.
- · Avoid public criticism of the church, leadership, or other members on social platforms.
- When necessary, include disclaimers such as: "Views expressed are my own and do not represent Peace Memorial EPC."

5. Policy Violations

Concerns about inappropriate social media use by staff, volunteers, or members should be directed respectfully to the Senior Pastor, Session, or appropriate ministry leader. Violations may result in:

A pastoral conversation or warning

• Temporary or permanent removal from social media responsibilities

• Further disciplinary action in line with EPC polity and the church's discipline procedures

6. Encouragement

Social media provides an opportunity to share the message of the Gospel, the love of Christ, the beauty of community, and the power of God's Word. We encourage members of Peace Memorial EPC to:

- Use platforms to encourage others and promote the gospel
- Share church events and resources
- Be a gracious and faithful digital witness in a divided world
- Consider the appropriateness of the forum. Ie, opt for using forums that allow for interaction, accountability and face-to-face engagement when addressing controversial topics. (Ie. Communications that engage people in respectful dialogue rather than just posting positions.)
- The pastor and Session are available to provide assistance as we strive to engage as Christians on Social Media.

"So whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God." —1 Corinthians 10:31

I invite you to prayerfully adopt this policy as well as you use social media. As we engage others directly or through social media, we, as followers of Jesus, should be mindful of how we share our thoughts, and what we choose to share in forums that limit direct interaction. This policy is not intended to stifle your expression, but to provide points to consider as you do share your thoughts. I and our other officers are available to provide guidance if you have questions or would like assistance in what it means to be a Christian presence online.

May the Lord guide all of us in our direct and in our virtual interactions with others for His purpose and glory!



The "Prayer Shawl Ministry" originated in 1998 to provide spiritual comfort to those in need and to celebrate life's joys. The shawls are tangible representations of God's love & compassion for his people and are symbols of hope. Shawls may be knitted or crocheted, quilted, woven or machine knitted, however, they are made with deliberate intention and prayer for the recipient. Patterns vary but are representative in 3's for Father, Son, & Holy Spirit. In Biblical times prayer shawls were worn during prayer times to enhance the spiritual connection with God. They serve to remind the wearer of God's presence and commandments. Today's concept of prayer shawls is rooted in the Tallit of the Jewish people. It was worn during morning prayer time and the

tassels are symbolic of the 613 commandments of the Torah. The tallit is a physical representation of God's enduring presence and protection. Over time the shawls have evolved and were incorporated into Christianity and other faiths.

A prayer shawl ministry group is a powerful experience for all involved. When the group meets there is a devotional and time of meditation and prayer. Groups meet from once a month to weekly. Prayer is the integral component and in each stitch is a prayer. Prayer shawls are made for both known recipients and unknown recipients to offer comfort or joy. The group can be ecumenical in nature and involve more than one congregation. Once completed the prayer shawl is blessed, generally in a church service, then available for distribution. Members of the ministry generally provide their own materials, however some churches budget monies for the supplies. Any yarn can be used, however Homespun by Lion is the yarn of choice.

Giving, receiving, and the making of a prayer shawl is a very real spiritual experience. Interested in this awesome ministry? A prayer shawl can make a major difference for both the crafter and recipient. Coming soon......stay tuned!!!

The class will consist of three one-hour sessions, covering:


- Our history and mission as a congregation


BIRTH CENTER MINISTRY BEGINS
